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5. REPORTS OF OFFICERS AND STANDING COMMITTEES

a. Committee Reports

1) Policy Committee Report

Jeannie Dodd reported the Policy Committee met at 6:00 PM this evening prior to the Board meeting. The committee is recommending the following policies be warned for adoption:

i. Bids and Quotations – 3323

Increase the limit for quotations from \$4,999 to \$9,999 and the limit for bids from \$5,000 to \$10,000

ii. Charging Policy – 3542.43

Increase the charged meal limit from four meals to six meals and other minor language changes

iii. Nondiscrimination – 0521

a) Building Committee Update

Michael Morrill reported some work was completed over April vacation and other work is scheduled for the summer.

a) Carrie Blackmar reported the committee is recommending two textbook adoptions.

b. Financial Reports, Nancy T. Cole

Nancy Cole updated the Board on the year-end expenditure report for 2017-2018. An excess cost report and Family Resource Center report were also presented.

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c. Superintendent's Report, William J. Hull

Mr. Hull updated the Board and discussion took place on the following items:

- 1. The annual town meeting was successful and the Board of Education budget passed.
- 2. The Wall of Honor Induction was May 5, 2018. The event was well attended.
- 3. Marieanne Viens reported the Memorabilia Committee met to continue discussions on items and locations. Historical data was the focus of the last meeting.
- 4. The next Regional Collaboration meeting is June 14, 2018 at 5:30 at Eastconn.
- 5. The District Website is being revised. A Webmaster has been hired to manage the website.
- 6. The elementary cafeteria floor will be replaced this summer. There is an abatement project associated with this work, so the cafeteria will be closed for the abatement work. The middle school serving line will also be installed this summer.
- 7. The district is monitoring Health Insurance claims.
- 8. The Middle School Moving Up Ceremony is June 20, 2018 at 6:00 PM in the PMS Auditorium.
- 9. The Putnam High School Graduation is June 21, 2018 at 6:30 PM in the PMS Auditorium.
- 10. There may be a change in Graduation Rates due to requirements for students in the transition program. These students have satisfied graduation requirements but do not count towards graduation rates.
- 11. District staff is closely monitoring special education students who have been moving in and out of the district. Staffing may need to be added for 2018-19.
- 12. A Retirement Reception will be held on June 19, 2018.
- 13. The district has hired four new teachers and two are in shortage areas.
- 14. The district plans to purchase the CREC Science Curriculum for \$33,700.
- 15. Quotations for Memorial Park are in process. This work will be done over the summer.
- 16. School monthly reports were emailed separately.
