Use of Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs)

In order to assist individuals who may experience cardiac arrest on school property, the Putnam Board of Education has acquired external defibrillators for use in each school building. The AED and trained personnel shall be available during (1) the school's normal operational hours, (2) school-sponsored athletic events and practices on school grounds, and (3) school-sponsored events not taking place during normal school operational hours. It is the policy of the Board of Education to support the use of these automatic external defibrillators by trained personnel on school property. Each school shall have school staff trained in the use of AEDs and in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

The Board recognizes that in accordance with applicable legislation, it does not have to comply with these provisions if state, federal, or private funding is not available to it for AED purchasing and for school personnel training.

The Board recognizes that it may, in lieu of purchasing an AED, accept an AED donation provided the donated AED meets the U.S. Food and Drug Administration standards and the device is in compliance with the manufacturer's maintenance schedule. The Board may also accept gifts, grants, and donations, including in-kind donations, designated for an AED purchase and the costs of (1) inspecting and maintaining the device and (2) training staff in its use.

Emergency Action Response Plans

Not later than July 1, 2010, each school shall develop an emergency action response plan addressing the appropriate use of school personnel to respond to incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden cardiac arrest or a similar life-threatening emergency while on school grounds. Also by July 1, 2010, each school with an athletic department or organized athletic program shall develop an emergency action response plan addressing appropriate school personnel response to the same circumstances while attending or participating in an athletic event or practice on school grounds

The Superintendent or his/her designee shall be responsible for developing administrative regulations in furtherance of the Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) policy, in conformity with the provisions of applicable statutes and regulations.

Use of Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs)

I. Definitions:

Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) - means a device that: (A) is used to administer an electric shock through the chest wall to the heart; (B) contains internal decision-making electronics, microcomputers or special software that allows it to interpret physiological signals, make medical diagnosis, and, if necessary, apply therapy; (C) guides the user through the process of using the device by audible or visual prompts; and (D) does not require the user to employ any discretion or judgment in its use.

Predetermined AED Provider - that person who is CPR and AED certified and has a copy of his/her certification on record with the Putnam Public Schools.

II. Defibrillator Location

- 1. The Putnam Public Schools will have defibrillators in each school building.
- 2. The AEDs will be strategically placed and readily accessible to school staff trained in its use and in cardiopulmonary resuscitation to maximize rapid utilization.

III. Requirements for Predetermined AED Providers

- 1. Predetermined trained AED Providers shall be held accountable for the retrieval, use, and return of the AED when it is used.
- 2. On an annual basis, school staff trained in AED use and CPR shall certify in writing that he/she has read the Putnam Public Schools AED policy and administrative regulations, and provide such certification and a copy of AED and CPR training completion documentation to the Superintendent of Schools or designee.

IV. Responsibility for Operation, Maintenance and Record-Keeping

1. The school nurse at each building in which an AED is installed will check the defibrillator in the building on a regular basis, at least monthly. It will be that nurse's responsibility to verify that the unit is in the proper location, that it has all the appropriate equipment (battery, mask, case, emergency pack), that it is ready for use, and that it has performed its self-diagnostic evaluation. If the nurse notes any problems, or the AED's self-diagnostic test has identified any problems, the nurse must contact the Superintendent of Schools or designee immediately.

IV. Responsibility for Operation, Maintenance and Record-Keeping (continued)

- 2. After performing an AED check, the nurse shall make note on an AED service log (Appendix IV) indicating that the unit has been inspected and that it was found to be "In-Service" or "Out-of-Service."
- 3. The Superintendent of Schools or designee shall be responsible for the following:
 - a) AED service checks during the school nurses' contracted school year.
 - b) The replacement of equipment and supplies for the AED.
 - c) The repair and service of the AED.
 - d) All recordkeeping for the equipment during the contracted school year.
 - e) Training Records of Predetermined AED Providers which include:
 - CPR certification
 - AED certification
 - f) Maintaining a list of predetermined and properly certified AED providers approved by the Superintendent of Schools and/or the AED school Medical Advisor.
 - g) Incident record keeping.
 - h) Copies of the certifications signed by Predetermined AED Providers regarding understanding of and agreement to comply with Putnam Board of Education AED policies and procedures (Appendix III).
 - i) Providing/scheduling opportunities for CPR and AED training recertification for all Putnam Board of Education school nurses.
 - j) Assisting the school district with proper in-house training for other individuals designated by the district.
 - k) Reporting the need for revising the policy and administrative regulations to the Superintendent of Schools.
 - 1) Assisting Predetermined AED Providers in other appropriate ways as determined by the administration.
 - m) Registering the AEDs in accordance with state law.

V. Procedures for Use

- 1. Only appropriately trained Predetermined AED Providers shall be permitted to have access to AEDs.
- 2. Predetermined AED Providers trained in AED use and CPR accessing the AEDs shall maintain control of such equipment at all times.
- 3. Prior to returning an AED to its location, the Predetermined AED Provider shall ensure that the AED is functional. Any problems with the AED shall be immediately reported to the Superintendent of Schools or designee.
- 4. The Predetermined AED Provider must sign his/her name (as soon as practicable under the circumstances) and determine its service status upon removing it from its designated location and upon returning it. (Appendix I)
- 5. Predetermined AED Providers may only use AEDs in medically appropriate circumstances, in accordance with their training.
- 6. In the event of use, the Predetermined AED Provider shall, if possible, immediately notify the building nurse, the Superintendent of Schools, the District Medical Adviser, and the Director of Special Education, or designate another individual to do so.
- 7. Each time an AED is used, the AED Provider should complete a copy of the AED incident report. (Appendix II). The report should be forwarded to the Superintendent of Schools, (860) 963-6900 no later than 48 hours after the incident. The Superintendent of Schools will forward a copy to the District's Medical Advisor.

VI. Emergency Action Response Plans

1. By July 1, 2010, each school within the District shall develop an emergency action response plan.

- 2. Whenever a school District facility is used for a school-sponsored or school-approved curricular or extracurricular event and whenever a school-sponsored athletic contest is held at any location, the Principal or designee responsible for such school facility or athletic contest shall ensure that AED equipment is provided on-site and that there is present during such event, activity, or contest at least one staff person who is trained in accordance with applicable Connecticut statutes in the use of an AED. School-sponsored or school-approved curricular or extracurricular events or activities mean events or activities of the District that are, respectively, associated with its instructional curriculum or otherwise offered to its students. A school-sponsored athletic contest means an interscholastic or intramural activity of instruction, practice, or competition.
- 3. Where a school-sponsored competitive athletic event is held at a site other than a District facility, the Principal or his/her designee shall assure that AED equipment is provided on-site by the sponsoring or host District and that at least one staff person who is appropriately trained is present during such athletic event.
- 4. Each middle school and high school shall maintain the AED in a central location within the building and ensure its availability for those athletic events in which the District school is the home team and for any practice or intramural athletic events that occur at the school.
- 5. The District requires that the athletic trainer, coach, other designated staff member, or a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad member is available to respond as necessary at school sporting events in which the District school is the home team, or at any team practice or intramural athletic events that occur at the school.
