U.S. Senator Joe Lieberman, serving 1989-2013, has established the Joe Lieberman Connecticut Scholarship Fund to assist outstanding high school seniors from Connecticut. Up to five \$1,500 renewable scholarships will be granted each year for full-time study at any accredited two-year or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school.

Your assistance is needed to publicize this program.

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be United States citizens or permanent legal residents.
- Be high school seniors who reside in Connecticut and attend public or private high schools or home school in Connecticut.
- Plan to enroll in full-time undergraduate study at an accredited two-year or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school for the entire 2022-23 academic year.
- Have a minimum grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent).
- Demonstrate outstanding leadership potential and record of community service.

Please display the enclosed poster and encourage eligible students to apply. **The deadline for application submission is March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 3 PM Central Standard Time.**

***The first 500 applications received will be processed; therefore, students are encouraged to apply as soon as possible.***
