Preschool Registration Is Open!

We are accepting registrations for our 2024-2025 <u>nationally accredited</u> Putnam Preschool Programs.

Programs are for Putnam children who are 3 or 4 years old. There are part-day, school-day and full-day program options for families. Children do not need to be potty trained. Tuition is charged for our preschool programs on a very affordable sliding fee scale.

The registration packet is available at the Putnam Elementary School Main Office, our FRC webpage or you can contact Jessica Duffy for a packet.

Once you have completed your packet, you can drop it off at the PES Main Office or email completed packet to duffyj@putnam.k12.ct.us. Please call our office with any questions 860-963-6940.

Also needed for registration: Your child's Birth Certificate, Recent physical within 1 year and Immunization Records, Proof of Residency (i.e. mortgage or rental agreement, bill for a utility at your Putnam address) and Custody Agreements. Family Fun

(Parent/Child Activity & Learning)

Earth Day Necklace

Materials: soil, glue, popsicle stick, paper clip,
Dixie cup, blue & green paint, and yarn
Fill Dixie cup 2/3 full with soil. Cover the soil
with glue. Use a popsicle stick to stir soil and
glue together until it turns into a blob. Use your
hands to roll blob into a sphere. Place the paper
clip inside of it so that only one "hoop" is seen.
This will be used to hang the earth as a necklace.
Let the sphere dry overnight. Use the blue and
green paint on the soil ball to resemble the earth.

Allow the painted earth to dry overnight. String yarn through the paper clip. Tie the ends together to make a necklace!



A Recipe for Family Fun

Earth Day Treat



Ingredients: 1 cup blueberries cut in half, 1 cup green grapes cut in half, 1 package cream cheese, 1 tsp vanilla, 1 Tb sugar, Package of flavored rice cakes (or one large cookie base)

Instructions

Help your child cut grapes and blueberries in half. Help your child measure out 1 Tb sugar and 1 tsp of vanilla. Mix the sugar, vanilla and cream cheese in a small bowl.

Spread the cream cheese mixture onto the rice cake.

The last step is to tell them to create the earth by placing the blueberries for the water and the grapes for the land.







If you are a parent or caregiver that has concerns about your child's development, the CT Birth to Three System can help you!






Be in the know:

Developmental & Social-Emotional Screenings:

ASQ & ASQ-SE (Ages & Stages Questionnaires®). Track your child's development, from your own home, on your own mobile device. Answer a few questions on the Sparkler app, to keep track of your child's development from 2 months to 5 years.

Connect: The results of the screenings will be shared with you. If the ASQ's indicate your child may need some support, 211 or your local early childhood resource will reach out to help you.

Play and Learn: Access thousands of fun, developmentally appropriate, offscreen activities to help your child learn through play.
