Bylaws of the Board

Voting/Vote Recording

Voting, by the Board of Education, shall be by voice or show of hands. Unless there be a dissenting vote or votes, all votes shall be considered unanimous. On all votes not unanimous a record of each member's vote must be recorded. The Chairperson of the Board of Education, by law, has the authority to make motions, second motions, and make and present resolutions to the Board of Education and to vote in all matters presented to the Board of Education.
